Beverly Hills City Hall, California

Inside this 1932-built landmark, couples will find original terrazzo floors, marble walls, intricate ceilings, and an evolving art space known as the

Municipal Gallery. Outside, the dramatic Spanish-inspired edifice is surrounded by palm-fringed gardens, dramatic archways, and romantic balconies that create a sweet and sunny post-ceremony backdrop. A few blocks away from the courthouse, you'll find the city's famously manicured Beverly Gardens Park where couples can continue shooting red-carpet-worthy wedding photos.
